Parsons College Alumni Board

We interview a PCAA Board member in each issue of the PC News. Our highlighted member for this issue is **Ed Longanecker PC'68**.

- Q. What years did you attend Parsons?
- A. I started in 1964 and graduated in 1968
- Q. What were 3 things that you loved about Parsons and why?
- A. I liked the trimester platform which enabled me to use the entire year for school, the wonderful faculty and support system for instruction and learning, and the social arena with permissible and growing emphasis on independents vs traditional fraternity.
- Q. Who was your favorite professor(s) and why?
- A. Roberts hands down. She was so knowledgeable, had a wonderful method of presentation, and was a caring devoted instructor.
- Q. Where did you live while you were at Parsons?
- A. I started in Macfee, then to the dorms on the hill and stayed in dorm living through to graduation.
- Q. What is your hometown (where you lived when you came to Parsons)?
- A. I was born and spent 19 early years in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania prior to moving to the Midwest and Parsons.
- Q. What career(s) did you have after graduation?
- A. My training at Parsons was in English education. I taught English and Language Arts a few years in local schools, Pekin, Hedrick, and Mt Pleasant, Eventually acquired a Masters in School Administration and Special Education and served as principal at the local Mental Health Institute for children and adolescence at Towers School. Then off to the public sector as regional director of special education for several school districts in Southeastern Iowa through Great River Area Education Agency; I ended there after 39 years in public education.
- Q. Where do you live now?
- A. I currently live in Mt. Pleasant and have since 1970.
- Q. Why did you decide to join the Board?
- A. When the opportunity for the development of an Alumni association emerged, I had interest, proximity to the community, and a desire to preserve what I experienced there. I accepted the invitation and have stayed since its inception. I knew a few of the folks in the works for joining and appreciated their friendship and thought the mix was a good one.
- Q. Please feel free to share a memory or thoughts on Parsons.
- A. We started our own social group with about 15 members, rented our own retreat near Batavia, had our own beer system and even had the Distributor from Ottumwa service our system.

I was married in Barhydt Chapel in 1971 which has a special place in memory.


Then and Now







Did you know....

- ...Blum Stadium opened in 1966? Before that PC played at Fairfield High School.
- ...Parsons was bankrupt in 1955 when Millard G. Roberts came to the Presbyterian College? The college had 212 students when he arrived.
- ...Dr. Roberts created Satellite Colleges that operated under Parsons College with the "Parsons Plan" starting in the mid-1960s? They were:

Lea College in Albert Lea, Minn - 1966-1973

John J. Pershing College in Beatrice, Neb 1966-1971

Charles City College in Charles City, Iowa Open only 1 year 1967 and closed in 1968 College of Artesia in Artesia, N.M Closed in 1966-1973

Hiram Scott College in Scottsbluff, Neb Closed 1965-1972 (filed for bankruptcy in 1970) Midwestern College in Denison, Iowa Closed in 1965-1970

Parsons College lasted the longest from 1875-1973.


June Savastano Koc PC'67 and Jack Koc PC'69
