Parsons College Alumni Board

We interview a PCAA Board member in each issue of the PC News. Our highlighted member for this issue is Dave Neff PC'69, Treasurer of the Alumni Association.

- Q. What years did you attend Parsons?
- A. June of 1965 until June of 1969
- Q. What were 3 things that you loved about Parsons and why?
- A. The brotherhood of Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity.

 The genuine concern of the faculty focusing on the success of the students.

 The full schedule of entertainment that the college provided the community at the Fry Thomas Fieldhouse with top concerts of the leading performers of that day.
- Q. Who was your favorite professor(s) and why?
- A. Dr. John Wahrer, chairman of the Physical Education Department.
 Mrs. Vera Young professor in the Physical Education Department.
 Both Dr. Wahrer and Mrs. Young provided students in the Physical Education Department skills which were needed to make the student a top notch teacher and coach for their career.
- Q. Where did you live while you were at Parsons?
- A. I lived in the Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity house for all four years of my college career. I pledged in the fall of 1965 and activated in January of 1966.
- Q. What is your hometown (where you lived when you came to Parsons)?
- A. South Euclid, Ohio, an eastern suburb of Cleveland, Ohio.
- Q. What career(s) did you have after graduation?
- A. Upon graduation June of 1969 I was hired to be the Intramural Director for Parsons College. The following year I accepted the position of Director of Basic Skills Physical Education for the college, along with Sports Information Director and Cross Country and Track Coach. I held these positions until the College closed in 1973.

In June of 1974, I was hired at the Iowa State Bank & Trust Company in Fairfield as a teller and worked for the bank until I retired after 41 years with them. I was President of the bank for four years toward the end of my career.

- Q. Where do you live now?
- A. I remain a resident of Fairfield, Iowa.
- Q. Why did you decide to join the Board?
- A. I was involved with the Parsons College Foundation Fund and helped John Braidwood and John Blackstock formulate the Parsons College Wall of Honor where we were able to induct 100 alumni over a 10-year period to recognize contributions our alumni made to the country.

The PC Foundation helped raise over \$250,000 for the construction of the Fairfield Arts and Convention Center and to have naming rights for the Parsons College Alumni Hall at the Fairfield Arts & Convention Center. The Alumni Hall is where the Parsons College Wall of Honor is located. I was asked to join the Parsons College Alumni Association as an adjunct to the PC Foundation Fund.

Where are they now?

Pete Critelli PC'70 writes... Thank you for assuming the editor position/job. There are so many memories we each have, some are as clear as if yesterday. I have several that are just such. One memory is: cold, freezing, winter Sunday nights, the town completely still, no traffic, not a person walking, crystallized frosty air. Even George's Pizza and the Den were closed for the evening. Yet, on the west end of town, no more than three blocks from the square, there was a diner, open, and welcoming. An oasis, good food, hot coffee, and conversation.

This and That...

Did you know....?

- ...that Parsons was founded in 1875 with one building and 34 students? Parsons almost made it 100 before its closing.
- ...that Parsons was named for Lewis B. Parsons Sr., who directed that his estate to be used "to endow an institution of learning in the State of Iowa". Officially Parsons became a college 20 years after Lewis B. Parsons, Sr. died. It could have been located anywhere in Iowa, but when the committee fulfilling his wishes came to Fairfield, the decision was made.
- ...Parsons lost its accrediation more than once. In 1948, Parsons lost its accreditation but gained it back 2 years later?
- ...that Millard G. Roberts was appointed in 1955 and when he started his tenure there were only 357 students, and that the student body had over 5,000 students in 1966?
- ...that the first football game was played at Parsons on September 16, 1893 (we won 70-0)?
- ...that the Carnegie Library was opened in 1907?
